deadlines & late submissions


With the exception of **fully documented cases of emergency**, students who fail to submit engagement assignments on time will receive 0% credit. Likewise, students who fail to attend classes in which there is a quiz or other in-class graded assignment will receive 0% credit. For longer written assignments including the book review, the ethnography of religion report, and the final project, failure to submit these assignments on time will result in a -10% grade reduction for each day after the due date, up to a total of three days after which the student will be given 0% credit. Online quizzes, discussion questions, and other short assignments will not be accepted late.

Syllabus Quiz: This is a simple syllabus quiz to be completed at home. It is available on Jenzabar.

Book Review: In lieu of a mid-term exam, you will be invited to choose a book in Islamic Studies (broadly conceived) published in the past 15 years or so (2003-Present) and write a short review of it. Details and requirements for this assignment will be discussed in class and posted on Jenzabar.

Ethnography Report: For this assignment, you will conduct a brief ethnographic study of religion in Morocco. Details and requirements for this assignment will be discussed in class and posted on Jenzabar.

Final Project: Details will be given later in the course.

Attendance: All students are required to attend class. If you are not in class, you simply cannot do well. For that reason, attendance is mandatory and will be checked during each class meeting. The attendance grade for this course will follow the university's attendance policy (available in the handbook). Please, read it carefully and note that unexcused absences will result in a lower course grade. Every **two late arrivals** to class (or early departures) will count as **1 unexcused absence.**
